

Greetings

from the Enterprise Team

2024 proved to be a bumper year for the Enterprise tent, with a marked increase in entry numbers across the board, but particularly in the Bread and Cakes section. This is, of course, all down to the continued enthusiasm from the inhabitants of Winterton and its surrounds, and I hope that you're all feeling in a similarly competitive mood this year. Last year's gentlemen's Scotch Egg class attracted some vigorous competition and will remain in this year's line-up, we have also added classes for mini pizzas and for traditional pork pies (made my first ever pork pie yesterday – more practice required) amongst other new classes as suggested by local residents.

We are aware that the town is gaining a lot of residents in the new houses which have been built and we would really encourage all our new residents to join in with demonstrating their talents. We will be continuing last year's decision to abolish fees for entering exhibits and for adult prize money, although we will be keeping prizes for children.

One of the disadvantages of getting this Schedule out as early in the year as possible is that some aspects of organisation for this year are not yet fully decided. Possible changes include asking the schools to distribute all the children's prizes, rather than do so in the Tent late on the Sunday afternoon. We think people may find this a little more convenient and it makes a little more of a ceremony around the awards.

Our electronic entry system worked very well on the whole last year – but not for everyone. It has been suggested that distributing the "one-click" address to the entries page on our website might help find it, so that is included in this schedule (https://www.wintertonshow.co.uk/enterprise/individual/ for individuals, https://www.wintertonshow.co.uk/enterprise/school/ for schools). I've also worked with our web site designers to make it clearer when your entries have been accepted, or whether there is another stage to complete. I hope that helps. If all else fails we do have a manual backup available on the day so don't worry – we will accept your entries. The electronic entry pages should be open shortly after this printed Schedule has been distributed and we will continue to accept paper based entries.

We will be providing updates (and encouragement) on the Winterton Residents Facebook page as the year progresses and we really do hope to meet large numbers of entrants over Show weekend.

- 1 All classes are open to Amateurs only.
- 2 Only two entries per person per class (3 entries in photography)
- 3 All exhibits must be grown or made by the exhibitor; and must be available for showing for the 2 days of the Show Saturday and Sunday.
- Entering Exhibits. Schools may submit entries for multiple pupils via 4 the Winterton Show Website, or by direct submission of a spreadsheet to theenterprisesection@gmail.com. Separate instructions on spreadsheet submission will be distributed when this Schedule is released. School painting, collage and handwriting physical entries to be with us by Thursday 26th June 2025, others by 3rd July 2025. Collection from the school will be arranged on Thursday 26th June 2025. Pupils may submit additional individual entries up to the limit of entries per class. Individuals (adults or children) may submit entries via the Winterton Show Website, or by completion and delivery of the Entry form opposite. Physical entries should then be delivered to the Enterprise Tent between 0800 and 0945 on Saturday 5th July. Temporary parking is provided. Exhibitor cards and means of attaching them to your exhibit will be provided. Stewards will place your anonymised exhibit in the tent, cars should be removed from the site by 1000.
- 5 The marquee must be clear of all people except the judges and stewards by 10.00 am prompt.
- 6 Exhibits will be available for public viewing following judging at approximately 12.30 pm on the Saturday and from 10.00 am on Sunday until 3.45 pm.

 Exhibits may be collected between 4.00 and 4.30 on the Sunday of the Show, they may not be collected earlier.
- 7 After this time perishables will be disposed of. Could schools please arrange collection please.
- There will be a prize giving ceremony for adults in the marquee at around 3.45 pm on Sunday 6th July. Children's prizes will be delivered to their school for presentation.
- 9 Previous cups and trophies remain the property of Winterton Show unless otherwise stated. If you have any trophies from previous years would you please return them to The Enterprise Marquee during the weekend of the Show, or to Lawrence Roberts at Leek House, Leek Hill, Winterton. There is a parcel drop off box.

The Star trophies awarded to the children will be theirs to keep.
